## BMWMOCM – May 2008 Board Meeting

Present: Greg Anderson, Doug Dokken, Carrie Hanson, Lewis Marshall, Tim Cusick, Jim Herne, Jim Murphy

The Meeting was held at 7pm on May 15th at the REI store in Bloomington

Lewis provided the Treasurer's report:

- Club account: \$80.00 in deposits, no payments, for a balance of \$3,143.49
- Rally account: \$557.00 in deposits, no payments, for a balance of \$6,003.92
- Total for both club accounts: \$9,147.41

### Old Business:

#### 1. Accident Scene Management seminar:

Jim Murphy reported that 16 people participated in the ASM seminar held on May 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Hennepin County Public Library. Each participant paid \$20 for the seminar, giving the club an income of \$320. The seminar cost the club \$400, resulting in a loss of \$80 on this event.

#### 2. Experienced Rider Course:

Lewis reported that 9 people have signed up and paid for the upcoming ERC which will be held at the Hennepin Technical College in Brooklyn Park on June 7<sup>th</sup>. There are 3 openings still left on the seminar, and Lewis is confident that these slots will be taken before the course begins.

#### 3. Hiawatha Rally Report:

Carrie Hansen provided an update on the status of preparations for the Hiawatha Rally which will take place on May 30<sup>th</sup> to June 1<sup>st</sup> at Money Creek, Minnesota. Specific items that were reported on are as follows:

- Pancake Breakfast: Money Creek has recovered some of the kitchen equipment from the old restaurant and they will be able to offer rally participants a pancake breakfast in the pavilion on Saturday morning. The breakfast will be held between 7am and 10am, and the cost of the breakfast is not included in the rally fee.
- Rally Insurance: Carrie reported that she has not finalized the insurance coverage for the rally yet, but she will do so in the coming week. In past years the club has provided \$1M in coverage for the rally, but this year the coverage will be increased to \$2M. The cost of this insurance policy will be \$370. As was the case last year, the insurance will cover the GS ride as well, and this coverage adds 10% to the policy premium.
- Prizes for Field Events: The board discussed the issue of prizes for the winners of the field events, and agreed that as in the past winners will be awarded coupons for redemption at the various vendors at the rally, or ice cream cones. In most cases the winners would receive rally T-shirts.

- Door Prize Tickets: Carrie asked if the club still had a supply of door prize tickets and Greg reported that he had a large roll from the Holiday Banquet. He will get it to Carrie and that should be enough for each participant to get their door prize ticket.
- Status of Volunteer sign-up: Carrie reported that volunteer sign-up is doing well and she is confident that there will be enough volunteers available to cover all the activities that need volunteer participation.
- Rally Schedule Copies: Carrie inquired about where to have copies of the rally schedule photocopied and Lewis said that his son has a discount coupon for one of the major chains that would give us a good price on photocopies. Lewis will work with Carrie in the coming week to insure that the copies are made at a good price.

Their being no new business and needing to prepare for the Motorcycle Camping Seminar, the board voted to adjourn the meeting at about 7:40pm.

#### 4. Grand Marais Camping Trip:

Lewis reminded the board that he has made the arrangements for the Grand Marais camping trip which will take place on August 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. Lewis has reserved enough camp space for anyone that wishes to participate. The cost of the camping will be \$5/participant, and all other costs (meals, etc) will be each member's responsibility.

#### 5. Meet-to-Eat at Yaruso's:

Bob Cox has arranged for the next Meet-to-Eat which will be held at Yaruso's in St. Paul on Thursday May 22<sup>nd</sup> at 6:45pm. Yaruso's is St. Paul's oldest family owned Italian restaurant, having been in business since 1933. Bob claims there is plenty of off-street parking and there is also an outdoor terrace area that we can use – weather permitting!

## RIDING THE WAVE

Waving at other motorcyclists has long been encouraged by the motorcycle press. The line is usually that all motorcyclists share a common bond, choosing the rewards and risks of two wheeled travel over the bland drone of driving a car and that we should recognize this by waving to one another whenever possible.

I had tried to follow this sage advice until I read an article by Larry Grodsky a few years ago arguing that it just isn't safe to be waving at every passing motorcycle regardless of the circumstances. Grodsky, as I recall, noted that paying attention to the road just might be more important than making sure that no wave goes unreturned. If you think about that a little bit, it's so obvious that you have to wonder why anyone tries to perpetuate the practice. That said, I personally still find it hard to ignore even the most stupid of wavers and that's probably why the practice irritates me so much.

In addition to the obvious safety issues (and I've resolved not to go into a rant about the frantically waving, ape hanger equipped, cruiser riders with their feet-up-in-the-stirrups-medical-exam-position out for their third ride of the season and barely in control – AND, THE S.O.B. JUST LEFT A BAR!!!) there is the practical issue that on a nice day one can encounter a lot of motorcycles. If you happen to be passing through an area where cruiser bikes congregate, it is likely that you will encounter clump after clump of these folks out for a Sunday ride, each one waving at you like you're someone special. If you wave back at everyone, you might as well go buy a scooter so you can ignore shifting. When you don't wave back, you're labeled as an elitist BMW snob. Short of adopting the Dave Porter foam hand on a stick solution, you just can't win.

There are some situations when we all welcome a wave from a passing bike. A remote road, no traffic, bike goes by – sure, wave and acknowledge one another. That's not a stupid wave, at least not in my book. However, waving at a bike coming the other way during rush hour traffic on the freeway isn't in that category, nor is meeting another bike on Wisconsin 35 between Nelson and Pepin. So, why do I sometimes feel compelled to return a wave in those circumstances? Is there a support group for people who are trying to break the habit? Some penance to be done after returning a stupid wave? Are there any others who suffer from this Stupid Wave Return Syndrome, or am I the only one?

2008 Crow Creek Longriders Ride

“Wokakije Un Wicakiksuyapi”

A motorcycle ride to commemorate the forced movement of Dakota and Winnebago people in June of 1863. Takes place June 18th through June 21st, 2008, from Saint Paul, MN to Fort Thompson, SD

This is the Third Annual Commemorative Ride honoring the memory of the Dakota and Ho-Chunk Nations who were forcibly removed from Fort Snelling in Minnesota to Crow Creek, South Dakota after the conclusion of the Dakota Conflict of 1862.

Ride begins at Historic Fort Snelling at the confluence of the Minnesota and Mississippi Rivers at Saint Paul, MN. The motorcycle ride route follows the Mississippi and Missouri Rivers with overnight stops at Davenport, Iowa @ 358 miles; Big Lake State Park just North of Saint Joseph, Missouri @ 350 miles; and Fort Randall Pow Wow grounds, South Dakota @ 350 miles. The ride ends at Crow Creek, South Dakota @ 125 miles on the fourth day.

All riders are welcomed regardless of Ethnicity, political preference or National origin. That includes all makes and models of motorcycles as well.

**The 30th Annual USCA National Rally** – “The Lake Effect” will take place near Duluth, MN. More details can be found on the USCA website at “Rally Headquarters”. Duluth is a great place for a rally and we have a really nice venue. The Buffalo Valley Campground is located about 13 miles west of the heart of Duluth. We’ll have plenty to see and do with guided and self-guided rides, tours of the Aeros-tich factory and plenty of opportunities for visiting historic sites and beautiful natural features. We’ve got speakers lined up and a professionally run children’s program.

If you want to come early and learn to become a certified sidecar instructor, there is a S/TEP Instructor’s Preparation Course being offered before the rally, June 6 - 12. If you’re interested in taking a basic S/TEP sidecar training course instead of the instructor course, that is being offered on June 11 - 12, right at the beginning of the rally. There is limited space available in these courses so if you are interested, contact us soon!

The rally grounds are nicely shaded and there is a restaurant on the grounds. The bath facility is modern and clean. We have most of the campground to ourselves [the owners asked to keep a few RV spots to accommodate their regular cli-

ents]. We’re fortunate this year to have a large functions building that can seat over 200 for dinner. We’ll have activities rain or shine.

**The preregistration rally fees are:**

- Adult USCA Member \$30, non-members \$40
- Adolescent members age 10 - 18 \$15, non-members \$25
- Children 9 and younger are free
- After preregistration closes and at the gate all rates are \$5 more.

**What do I get for the money?**

- Tent camping on June 12-14 [departing on the 15th] is part of the deal. We’ve listened to our RV driving members and we’ve arranged a discount rate for campers that takes the tent fees into account. RVs can have a water and electric site [pull throughs available] for an additional \$15 per night.
